Social and Emotional Foundations for Learning (SEFL): All Inclusive Training

Module 1: Importance of Relationships

Positive interactions and relationships are the foundations for a child's social and emotional development. This session explores strategies that build these foundations, even during challenging moments. Discover your "hot buttons" and how to re-frame those thoughts for a more positive interaction with a challenging child or parent. You will learn techniques to build relationships with families, children and colleagues, to enhance your child care and early learning program.

Module 4: Promoting Children's Success through Social and Emotional Learning Techniques

Do you want to learn more techniques that support social and emotional development, even when children are displaying challenging behaviors? This module identifies strategies, such as problem solving and games to teach children emotional literacy and emotional regulation. You will see your classroom transform, as you help children identify emotions and teach them positive social skills that foster friendships. In this session you will learn about the third level of the CSEFEL teaching pyramid, which represents *Targeted Social Emotional Supports*.

PCAN: Parent/Provider Partnerships in Child Care

Unit 1: Building Collaborative Relationships with Families

Early childhood and child care professionals build partnerships with families as an important strategy to promote healthy child development. These partnerships can help prevent child abuse and neglect.

Supervision of Children

This training reviews the current State of Missouri licensing requirements for staff to child ratio in various child care settings. Active supervision is reviewed, and techniques are presented to assist the early learning professional in providing active supervision at all times. The six strategies for Active Supervision are reviewed along with a section on child elopement. This course is suitable for family child care, as well as programs or centers.

Basic Knowledge Curriculum (BKC): Early Childhood (EC)

Module 3: Child Safety and Prevention Awareness

You never want to be the one in charge when a child is seriously injured! After this session, you will know how to make spaces for children safer. Children will be much less likely to be badly hurt on your watch, and you will be better prepared to cope with those minor injuries that happen so often with young children. Learn the steps to prepare indoor environments to keep children safe, procedures that reflect proper storage and administration of medication, and what goes in a first aid kit.

Module 10: Creating a Welcoming Environment

Did you know that the way you arrange the classroom and outdoor areas directly affects how children act and learn? Discover how to include learning areas in your child care and early learning program. We will review how room arrangement and environment are key factors in child development. Learn to identify outdoor safety considerations and common outdoor weather related injuries.

Module 14: Professionalism

What makes you a professional? You are defined by what you do, what you say and how you present yourself to the world. Discover that child care and early learning is a profession and, like other professions, it has a code of ethical conduct that everyone in the field should follow.

Module 5: Supporting the Development and Well-Being of Infants and Toddlers

How do you affect the healthy brain development of infants and toddlers? This workshop will share the five Rs: how relationships, routines, respect, repetition, and responsive interactions influence a child's developing brain. Did you know that infants and toddlers are affected by stress too? Learn how you can support the well-being and mental health of these youngest children.
