Social and Emotional Foundations for Learning (SEFL): All Inclusive Training

Module 4: Promoting Children's Success through Social and Emotional Learning Techniques

Do you want to learn more techniques that support social and emotional development, even when children are displaying challenging behaviors? This module identifies strategies, such as problem solving and games to teach children emotional literacy and emotional regulation. You will see your classroom transform, as you help children identify emotions and teach them their positive social skills that foster friendships. In this session you will learn about the third level of the CSEFEL teaching pyramid, which represents *Targeted Social Emotional Supports*.

Supervision of Children

This training reviews the current State of Missouri licensing requirements for staff to child ratio in various child care settings. Active supervision is reviewed, and techniques are presented to assist the early learning professional in providing active supervision at all times. The six strategies for Active Supervision are reviewed along with a section on child elopement. This course is suitable for family child care, as well as programs or centers.

Early Childhood (EC)**

Module 4: Routine Care: Sleeping, Hand Washing and Diapering

Can changing diapers, toilet learning, hand washing and other daily care routines be more fun and less of a chore? Can they be times for learning and sources of a child's sense of self? Absolutely! Learn how to make the day-to-day routines a delight, and keep children healthier and safer in the process. Discover the essential tools to reduce the spread of germs, and become properly prepared for handwashing, diapers and sleeping procedures within child care and early learning programs.

Module 7: Planning Experiences for Children

Ever wonder, what am I supposed to do all day with the children? This session will answer that question by teaching you many approaches to planning and teaching. Imagine the advantages of a classroom where all the children are involved and families are supportive! This workshop will define developmentally appropriate practice and describe how development is fostered by play. You will learn that playing is learning and learning is playing. Discover the difference between child-and teacher-directed activities. We will describe intentional teaching and help you learn how to communicate the benefits of play to families.

Module 11: Creating Daily Routines

How does your day look through the eyes of a child? Are the many questions - what is next, what are we doing, when will we eat - overwhelming you? Learn how to create a flexible daily schedule. Discover how the events children participate in throughout their day can foster their development.
